# Personal Profile

The first section of your CV should be a short summary, written in the third person, as if someone was talking about you. This gives the reader immediate background knowledge about you and should be about 2 / 3 lines.

Examples:

- A good communicator who enjoys responsibility and meeting deadlines.
- An experienced labourer who is learning new skills and training as a carpenter.
- A hard working administrator, now looking to further her skills and ready for a new challenge.



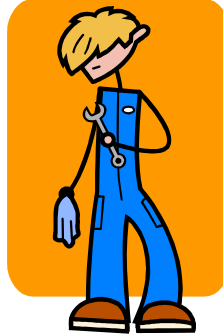

Did you attend on time every day of your work experience?	<input type="checkbox"/>	Reliable, committed, punctual
Were you dealing with the public?	<input type="checkbox"/>	Communication skills, confidence, experience in dealing with the general public
Did you use the telephone?	<input type="checkbox"/>	Communication skills, able to deal with queries and pass on to the relevant people
Did you get on with the people you worked with?	<input type="checkbox"/>	Sociable, able to mix with a wide range of people

## Outside school / college

- List any sports you play or clubs you belong to
- Include details of what responsibilities you have outside of education eg looking after younger members of your family, cooking for your family etc.

If you are still struggling ....

Some examples to give you an idea of how to make yourself sound interesting:

Example: *Reading detective novels, watching sci-fi films, Socialising with friends at my local youth club, swimming twice a week.*

Giving a little bit of detail gives the impression that you have specific interests. Below is an example of how to make yourself look boring!

Example: *Reading, watching TV, going out, swimming*
