The draft Children's Services Facilities Contributions Supplementary Planning Document establishes the mechanism for collecting developer contributions to range of Children's Services facilities such as primary and secondary schools, provision for children with special educational needs and other facilities to support young children and their families. This therefore provides a mechanism to contribute to or improve the opportunity for equality within the age and disability protected characteristics. These opportunities will be determined on a case by case basis, and be dependent on the development proposals put forward to the council.

### **Evidence Considered During Screening**

The Children's Services Facilities Contributions SPD expands on principles already established through the adopted Island Plan Core Strategy, which itself was subject to an Equalities Impact Assessment.

It has also been through its own formal public consultation (targeted in the first instance to Town and Parish Councils and Architects and Agents), which was advertised in the local paper and on the Council's website.

The evidence of how feedback has been taken into consideration in the formulation of the SPD is set out in Appendix 1 – Consultation Statement to the SPD.

As well as providing evidence on how local people have been consulted, the document has also been the subject of a conformity check with the policies of the Island Plan Core Strategy and the National Planning Policy Framework. This conformity check has concluded that the content of the guidance is in general conformity with the Island Plan Core Strategy.
