<b>Decision reference</b>	49/10
<b>Decision taken</b>	Option 1 – THAT the Isle of Wight Coast Shoreline Management Plan 2 and the policies set out therein be adopted
<b>Reasons for decision</b>	To balance the management of coastal flooding and erosion risks, with natural processes.  To determine technically, economically and environmentally sustainable policies for management of the shoreline for the next 100 years
<b>Additional reasons</b>	To align with the following Corporate themes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A safe and well-kept Island</li> <li>• An inspiring Island</li> </ul>
<b>Options considered and rejected</b>	Option 2 – To vary some or all of the coastal defence policies set out in the draft Isle of Wight SMP2, and summarised in Appendix 1  Option 3 – Not to adopt the draft Isle of Wight SMP 2
<b>Representations Received</b>	Representations were received from Wootton Bridge Parish Council, Fishbourne Parish Council, Woodside Residents Association, East Bank Residents and Quarry Abbey around existing and new defences for the Creek, new defences and a proposed new study for the Creek Mouth and the future of the Harbour Authority.  The Cabinet Member responded by advising that the issues raised should not influence or change the coastal defence options as set out in the report
