

WELCOME TO GURNARD

Gurnard is a quaint, attractive beach with a mixture of shelving sand and shingle to the west of Cowes. It offers the ideal location for family bathing, as well as being a good spot for trying out water sports at the adjacent boat park, which include windsurfing, sailing and jet skiing. A distinctive promenade lined with beach huts sits alongside the beach, leading to a grass embankment which is ideal for picnics and family games. The nearby Waters Edge Restaurant is the perfect place to enjoy the magnificent Solent sunset over dinner.

Access Statement for Gurnard, Isle of Wight

Pre-Arrival

The number 32 bus will drop you outside the Woodvale pub which is opposite the beach. This bus service is managed by the Community Bus Partnership, a joint venture between Southern Vectis, the Isle of Wight Council, and the local parish and town councils where the buses run. The buses are all driven by volunteers.

Car Parking and Arrival

On-street parking is available and is free of charge. Spaces can be found on the edge of the green which is adjacent to the beach as well as areas leading onto the Esplanade.

There are two disabled parking bays on a flat tarmaced surface which leads directly onto the Esplanade.

Areas Adjacent to the Beach

The award beach runs parallel with the Esplanade which also runs alongside Gurnard Village Green.

Barriers are installed at each end of the Esplanade which prevents vehicles access but permits wheelchairs and push chairs.

Pedestrians and cyclists can both use the Esplanade.

Beach Access Points

Access is made via a concrete slipway and steps on to the beach. The depth of the slipway is very shallow but the steps have handrails to assist with descent.

On the Beach

The beach is made up of sand and shingle which is litter picked on a daily basis throughout the summer season.

Gurnard is popular for water sports therefore care must be taken when bathing.

A first aid supply point is available and is held at the Water's Edge restaurant.

Public Toilets

Toilet facilities are available above the beach adjacent to Gurnard Sailing Club.

The toilet facility measures 28 square metres and consists of six cubicles, one urinal and a disabled facility.

Cleansing facilities include five hand basins and three electric hand driers.

The toilet block is on a slight incline but is easily accessible to all.

Food & Drink Outlets

Gurnard is served by the Water's Edge Restaurant which offers a wide range of hot and cold food as well as ice-creams. Access to this premise is on a level surface apart from the door threshold.

The Woodvale is a public house located at the top of the village green. This establishment also offers hot and cold food as well as alcoholic beverages. Access can be made via a stroll over the green or else a walk around which would take no longer than ten minutes.

Additional Information

Gurnard beach is a dog free location with prohibitions that apply between May and September inclusive.
