Next summer's A-levels and GCSEs in England are going ahead - but with slimmed-down content and a start date pushed back by about three weeks.

Most exams will now start from 7 June, rather than mid-May, in an attempt to make up for lost teaching time.

School leaders have called for a "Plan B" in case the pandemic makes it impossible to take exams. Education Secretary Gavin Williamson said back-up plans will be produced later this term for "all scenarios".

"Exams are the fairest way of judging a student's performance so they will go ahead, underpinned by contingency measures developed in partnership with the sector," said Mr Williamson. "Students have experienced considerable disruption and it's right we give them, and their teachers, the certainty that exams will go ahead and more time to prepare," he said.

Results days

The announcement from Mr Williamson also says that results days for A-levels and GCSEs will be on the same week - 24 August for A-levels and 27 August for GCSEs.



The Russell Group of Universities have a website which helps students to consider which A-levels they might choose to study in Sixth Form or College. Called "Informed Choices" it offers advice on the A-levels which top-performing Universities recommend.

Wondering what T-levels are?

T-levels are new qualifications which are being phased in between 2020 and 2023.

The first 3 T Levels are now available at selected colleges, schools and other providers across England. A further 7 T Levels will be available in September 2021 with the remaining courses starting in either 2022 or 2023.

T Level courses include the following compulsory elements:

- a technical qualification, which includes:
 - core theory, concepts and skills for an industry area
 - specialist skills and knowledge for an occupation or career
- an industry placement with an employer
- a minimum standard in Maths and English if students have not already achieved them
