

# VEHICLE PERMIT FOR DEPOSITING HOUSEHOLD WASTE AND RECYCLING AT A RECYCLING CENTRE

## TERMS & CONDITIONS

The permit scheme allows access to the household waste recycling centers (HWRCs) at Lynnbottom and Afton Marsh for residents who use one or more of the vehicles identified in these terms and conditions to dispose of their own household waste

### Vehicles needing permits

Householders who wish to use the following types of vehicle to dispose of **their own** household waste at a HWRC must have a permit:

- Any vehicle marked for commercial purposes including all sign written vehicles
  - \*Van (including sprinter vans and Campervans);
  - ^Car derived vans and similar type vehicles
  - Light goods vehicle;
  - Pick-up truck or similar vehicle with an open cargo area
  - Flat Bed truck
  - +Tipper vehicles (restrictions apply – see below)

- \* **Vans/Commercial vehicles** which have been hired for four or less days will not require a permit, however the rental agreement **must** be shown to the meet and greet staff. You will not be permitted to dispose of your waste without a valid rental agreement
  - ^ **Car-derived Vans:** Some cars, MPVs and 4x4 (for example, Land Rover Defenders) are classed as car-derived vans and will be required to have a vehicle permit to bring household waste to the HWRC's. If your vehicle meets **all three** of the criterion set out below, your vehicle will require a permit:
    - ❖ there are no rear seats, rear seat belts or mountings
    - ❖ there is a payload area with floor panel in the rear of the vehicle
    - ❖ There are no side windows in the rear of the vehicle - or if present, side windows will be opaque and fixed (with no means of opening or closing)

Any vehicle that does not meet all three of the above criterion will not require a permit.
  - + **Tipper vehicles** are not permitted to use the household waste recycling centre at either Afton Marsh or Lynnbottom. However, tipper vehicles are permitted to dispose of their household waste in the Commercial Waste Recycling Centre at Lynnbottom. Tipper vehicles using this facility are recommended to visit between 4.30pm and 8pm (5pm winter opening hours) and must not use their tipper function at any time. Tipper vehicles are not permitted to use the CWRC at any time on Sundays.

### Vehicles NOT Permitted to use the HWRC

- Tractors
- Agricultural vehicles
- Vehicles above 3.5 tonnes
- Horseboxes

## Permit Terms:

1. Permits are tied to the vehicle not to the driver. Every time the vehicle uses the site will count as a visit.
2. Each permit is valid for 12 months from the date of issue
3. Each permit enables 12 visits. Each card has 12 scratch off panels, one will be removed on each visit by the HWRC staff.
4. Permits are valid for Lynnbottom and Afton Marsh HWRCs only, and are not valid for the Mobile HWRC.
5. Vehicles that qualify for a permit will receive one permit card identifying the vehicle make, model, registration, colour and the permit date of issue.
6. Multiple visits in one day will each be counted as an individual visit.
7. Once 12 visits have been made, the site staff will retain the permit.
8. A new permit may be applied for after 12 visits have been made or 12 months have passed from the date of issue.
9. Amey will remove permits from persons using them to deposit commercial waste illegally.
10. Persons suspected of depositing trade waste at the HWRC will be required to complete a declaration form confirming the waste they are carrying is their own household waste. These will be stored and cross referenced if illegal use is suspected.

## Permit application process:

1. Permits can be applied for online at [www.iwight.com/waste](http://www.iwight.com/waste) or by contacting the Isle of Wight Council on (01983) 823777.
2. Following a successful application, Amey will post the permit to the address given on the application within 10 business days. Vehicles will not be permitted to access HWRCs until they have a valid permit. Application reference numbers will not be accepted as a form of entry for vehicles requiring a permit.

## How to use the permit

On arrival at an HWRC, please hand your permit to a member of site staff who will confirm that your vehicle details match those shown and mark the permit to indicate that one visit has been used

Only household wastes that are permitted at the HWRC may be deposited.

Residents are requested to segregate recyclables prior to arrival at the site to ensure all materials are correctly recycled.

## If you change your vehicle

Destroy your existing permit, and then apply for a new permit with the new details. The permit is only valid for the vehicle that appears on the permit.
